<u>Overview</u>

Jupiter Christian School designates a specific time, annually, for all upper school students to participate in intensive, hands-on, applied-learning service activities during the week prior to spring break. This week is known as Minimester.

The courses offered are designed to fully involve the student in meaningful endeavors. The goal is that the experiences gained will transform hearts and minds of students by challenging their beliefs and assumptions about the world.

Minimester has become a favored tradition with students. Our students have acquired a new direction and focus as a result of the experience. The opportunities afforded also serve as extensions of the academic program, helping to establish essential links between what a student learns in the classroom and the world to which they have been called to serve.

Minimester is an academic, service—learning week, and participation is <u>mandatory</u>. Registration will take place October 4—19. Registration forms must be signed by a parent, be accompanied by the appropriate deposit, and turned in to the Upper School Office. Courses are filled on a first-come, first served basis. Upon completion of each Minimester course, students will be evaluated and will receive a pass or fail grade, which will be listed on their permanent transcript.

Please note: travel prices are based on current airfare rates, and are subject to change if the cost of airfare increases before flights can be reserved. Assigned Course Offerings

STEM Minimester—7th Grade

This 7th grade STEM experience includes studying the different waterways and its abiotic and biotic ecosystem. Students will journey to the Loxahatchee River museum, Loggerhead Turtle Museum, Sea World, and the Florida Oceanographic Coastal Center in Stuart, FL for demonstrations and field research. During and after the trip, the students will work on a culminating project which will include field research, labs, inference of real time data, and applications of math for the engineering project of their choice. This STEM Minimester is <u>mandatory</u> for all 7th grade students. *Dates: March 11-15 / Grade 7 Cost: \$175 / Deposit: \$50 / Led by Mrs. Eve*

Engaging the Heart-8th Grade

The 8th grade class will travel to Camp Highland in Georgia where they will craft intentional experiences that develop leaders and engage hearts. Camp Highland is a Christian camp that specializes in intentional Christ-centered growth and peer relationships through God's love and His Word. The trip will include a day of service to the local community, nightly praise and worship, high-ropes courses designed to build community, along with many other fun activities. This trip is a platform for the transition into High School and is mandatory for all 8th grade students. Dates: March 10–15/Grade 8

Florida College Tour-10th Grade

The Sophomore class will attend the 17th Annual Florida College Tour. During this time, students will have the opportunity to experience a variety of Florida colleges and universities ranging from Christian colleges to private and state universities. Students will have the opportunity to tour campuses, visit classes, experience various dining options, and hear from Admission Directors. This trip is <u>mandatory</u> for all 10th grade students. *Dates: March 11—14 / Grade 10*

Capstone Internship—11th Grade*

This week of experiential learning will serve as the first step of the Capstone process and help students identify a problem to be solved through field research, project-based learning, and realworld application in various fields. Juniors are afforded the opportunity to work with a certified professional based on their identified career cluster and/or interests. All arrangements will be coordinated by the student and approved through Mrs. Flesch, Capstone Coordinator.

*11th grade students may choose a local or international option to fulfill their Capstone internship. Their choice must have a connection to their projected Capstone project. To select this option, students must identify their project focus and fulfill a leadership position as set forth by Mrs. Flesch and their trip leader. *Dates: March 11—15 / Grade 11 Cost: varies depending on choice / Led by: Mrs. Flesch*

Capstone Service-Learning-12th Grade

Social activist, scientist, writer, inventor, and educator Ben Franklin stated: "Tell me, and I'll forget. Teach me, and I remember. Involve me, and I will learn." This week is provided for senior students to become active participants and leaders in their learning and complete the "heart" of Capstone: the service-learning project.

*Students will use their field experience, research, and mentorship to address a school, local, or global problem through service, working as a trip leader on an optional course offering, on a team of peers locally or independently with a professional. This option is <u>mandatory</u> for all 12th grade students who have <u>not</u> yet completed their capstone service-learning project hours. *Dates: March 11—15 / Grade 12 Cost: \$0 / Led by: Mrs. Flesch / Student Cap: 60*
