Job Summary: The K-4 Student Development and Life Skills Teacher must be a spiritually sensitive individual who understands the mission and philosophy of Jupiter Christian School and is committed to help see it become a reality in the lives of our students by manifesting, by precept and example, the highest Christian virtue and personal decorum, serving as a Christian role model (I Timothy 4:12) both in and out of school (Luke 6:40), and as an example to parents and fellow employees in judgement, dignity, respect, and Christian living according to the Conditions of Employment outlined in the JCS faculty contract. The K-4 Student Development and Life Skills Teacher must be a born-again Christian with spiritual maturity in academic and leadership abilities that will enable him/her to teach God's truth. The ability to communicate well with various types of people, handle confidential information appropriately, maintain a courteous, professional, and respectful attitude and integrity in all situations are pre-requisites.

I. General Description of Duties and Responsibilities

- a. Plan and implement the scripture-based SEL (Social-Emotional Learning) program across K-4 students on West and East campuses.
- **b.** Guide students in K-4 through weekly lessons rooted in biblical principles and real-world application of the core competencies of SEL education: self-awareness, self-management, responsible decision making, social awareness, and relationship skills.
- c. Support Director of Spiritual Life by helping plan and lead weekly chapel for 2nd-4th grades (two to four times per month).
- d. Support K-4 teachers and leadership in positive, proactive, and preventive discipline strategies.

II. Essential Job Requirements

- a. Establishes and maintains a positive classroom environment conducive to learning. This includes spiritual, academic, emotional, social and physical growth and maturity.
- b. Respectfully submits and is loyal to God-appointed authority.
- c. Integrates a biblical worldview.
- d. Follows and updates the JCS curriculum guides in implementing the SEL program.
- e. Differentiates learning activities and instruction that meets the needs of the students in the class.
- f. Educate and model a school culture of diversity, belonging, and inclusion.
