### OUR MISSION

### ACCREDITATION

Jupiter Christian School was founded in 1963 and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI) and the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). The school features a strong academic program within a Christ-centered curriculum. JCS provides opportunities for its students through fine arts, athletics, clubs and organizations.

### ATHLETICS AND ACTIVITIES

Jupiter Christian School is a member of the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA). Jupiter Christian's athletic program includes opportunities for both Middle School and JV/Varsity level teams and features basketball, baseball, cheerleading, cross-country, football, golf, lacrosse, tennis, track & field, volleyball, beach volleyball, swimming and wrestling. Additional opportunities for involvement include community service, Bible studies, missions, debate, chess, photography, theatre, art, music, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, National Honor Society, National Art Honors Society, Tri-M Music Honors Society, and Student Government Association.

### HONORS PROGRAM

An Honors Program diploma requires 10 credits in courses that are Honors, Advanced Placement, or Dual Enrollment. To receive an honors diploma, the student must have a 3.0 un-weighted GPA.

### SCHOOLS OF DISTINCTION

A three-year specialty course track (often referred to as a magnet program) is available for 10th-12th graders. Students can choose one of three different programs: Fine Arts • Medical • Computer Science—where they will have the opportunity to explore these professional fields through curricular enhancements, mentoring relationships and experiential learning. Successful completion of their chosen track will allow them to graduate with a Schools of Distinction Designation.

### SENIOR CAPSTONE

The Capstone is a mandatory, personalized and participatory culminating project at JCS. Tackling a real-world problem through a Christian worldview, students study, complete an immersion experience along with service, write a research paper, and conclude their studies with a multimedia presentation.

### DUAL ENROLLMENT

JCS has established a partnership with Palm Beach Atlantic University which allows students to enroll in college coursework while on the Jupiter Christian School campus. These classes will be offered in conjunction with their traditional curriculum. Students must hold a 3.0 cumulative GPA and have completed their sophomore year to participate.

### MINIMESTER

During the week prior to spring break, students participate in intensive, hands-on, applied learning activities with faculty as an extension of Jupiter Christian's academic and service learning goals. These Minimester course trips are offered locally, nationally, and internationally and encompass themes such as history, service-learning, college tours, immersion experiences, and more.

### ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

Jupiter Christian School has two honor distinctions based on all credit courses for each semester.

Principal's List: Students receiving all A's and a 4.0 or higher for the grading period.

Honor Roll: Students receiving all A's or B's and a 3.5 or higher for the grading period.
